

The American Sunday School Union Papers

1817 - 1915

The American Sunday school - both as a movement and an institution - had far-reaching effects on the development of our nation's social, cultural and religious values. For example, the American Sunday School Union (ASSU) provided the materials and training by which many frontier adults and children learned to read while promoting the establishment of Sunday schools throughout the nation. The American Sunday School Union Papers provides an historical archive documenting the key leaders, projects, strategies and attitudes that characterized the Sunday School movement of the 19th and 20th centuries. Founded in Philadelphia in May of 1817, the Union began as a coalition of local Protestant Sunday school groups. The Union's goals were to promote the establishment of Sunday schools and to provide local communities with libraries and materials for religious instruction. From the beginning, this was a non-denominational organization that set aside differences in doctrine to teach the masses the "cardinal truths of Christianity." This 500,000-page microfilm collection features: correspondence, reports from the network of ASSU missionaries on the social, economic, cultural and political conditions of the expanding United States, administrative records documenting the Union's internal struggles and the complete run of the Youth's Penny Gazette (1843-1860), the most important juvenile periodical published by the Union. Through these papers, researchers and students of religion, education, history and American studies can study the effects of the ASSU on American religious and cultural ideals.

Studies performed by the Columbia University Department of Nursing Education and by national organizations, government reports on health and nursing (particularly during the World Wars) and a biographical file of prominent nursing pioneers are included. Supplement to Part II: The Archives, 1986-2000

The Supplement to Part II, released in 1986, adds another body of important material to this collection. It contains the personal and professional papers of two of nursing's outstanding 20th century leaders: Eleanor C. Lambertsen and Eugenia K. Spalding. Eleanor Lambertsen was active in many facets of nursing, including the National League for Nursing and the American Hospital Association. Included in this section are records from her many government positions with the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, the Veteran's Administration and the Department of Defense, plus her work for New York State and many prestigious health foundations. The papers of Eugenia K. Spalding document her major role in the education of nursing faculty and the appraisal and improvement of nursing education programs. Among the materials included are papers pertaining to her work in the United States Public Health Service, her tenure at Teachers College, Columbia University, as well as her lectures, addresses and published works.

Massachusetts Historical Society Collections

1419 - 1970

The Massachusetts Historical Society is an independent, not-for-profit research institution incorporated by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. It was founded in 1791 for the threefold purpose of collecting, preserving and disseminating resources for the study of American history. It was not only the first North American historical society but also the first library of any kind to devote its primary attention to collecting Americana. The Horace Mann Papers

Widely recognized today as "the father of American education," Horace Mann was largely a self-made man. Subjected to the most primitive of childhood educations in the early 19th century, Mann floundered before meeting an itinerant tutor who prepared him for Brown University in a matter of months. He went on to a distinguished career as lawyer, state legislator and president of the Massachusetts state senate. In 1837, however, Mann jumped at the chance to reshape Public education as secretary to the new state board of education With only moral suasion to rely on, he rebuilt Massachusetts' educational system and promoted centralized programs still in place around the country: the first normal colleges, minimum school year laws, free nonsectarian education and adequate funding. He later served as a U.S. congressman and president of Antioch College. This microfilm edition of Mann's papers includes his general correspondence, lectures, sermons, speeches, legal notes and journals, letters by Mary Peabody Mann and Elizabeth Palmer Peabody; letters by Eliza A. White to Mary T. Peabody; and other miscellaneous papers and letters from the Massachusetts Historical Society holdings. Individual reels may be purchased.

Minutes and Reports of the Committee of Council on Education*

1839 - 1899

The Committee of (the Privy) Council on Education was established in 1839 primarily to distribute government grants to the elementary schools run by voluntary societies. This Education Department soon developed in effect into a ministry of education, which was reconstituted in 1899 as the Board of Education. The annual minutes (from 1854 called reports) contain a wealth of information on the working of government educational policy and on schooling in particular towns and areas.

1881 - 1976

Now entering its second century, the American Association of University Women (AAUW) is recognized and regarded for its support of research on a variety of important social issues such as:

- Sex discrimination
- Alcoholism
- Child abuse
- Mental health
- · Civil rights
- Affirmative action
- Prison reform

And all through its history, the AAUW has played a significant role in the advancement of women's rights, the enrichment of higher education, and the shaping of public policy. The archival records of the organization constitute one of the most complete collections available that provides an in-depth view of women's achievements. This collection includes correspondence, historical documents, and detailed surveys tracing the progress of the AAUW from inception to 1976. Chronicled are the AAUW's attempt to secure equal opportunities for women in the academic community, their support of legislation for the betterment of society, and efforts to improve education at all levels. Published from the holdings of the AAUW National Archives in Washington, D.C., this collection is a rich resource for institutions with programs in the areas of women's history, education, minority rights, political science, lobbying, and international relations. American Culture Series II (ACSII)

1493 - 1875

The 5,600 titles in the Series II collection represent what are considered to be fundamental research materials in interdisciplinary American Studies curricula. The titles in American Culture Series II include all those in American Culture Series I. This larger collection also expands the pre-1806 offerings and extends the series through 1875. Selected and compiled in the mid-1950s by the Committee on Microfilm Bibliography of the American Studies Association, the series includes information on American education, religion, pacifism, feminism, the city, the history of science and many other subjects of importance to American historiography. The bibliography of pre-1876 books and pamphlets on which this collection is based was edited by David R. Weimer and is offered free with the American Culture Series II. Early American Children's Books

1680 - 1820

This microfiche program consists of a selection of 680 titles from the A.S.W. Rosenbach Collection of Early American Children's Books housed in the Free Library of Philadelphia. Included are primers, grammars, history and geography books, prayer books and catechisms, biographies, poetry, prose fiction and books of etiquette, published from the late 17th through the early 19th centuries. The Rosenbach package includes 680 books on microfiche; and an author/title index giving both the microfiche number and the entry number in the collection. *Includes index*

English Linguistics

1500 - 1800

Like all living languages, English has gone through tremendous changes, perhaps the greatest in the years 1500-1800, as it continued its movement away from Middle English. It was during this time that scholars began to standardize the language and impose grammatical rules. This need to standardize was driven by the onslaught of printing technology, which produced increasingly greater quantities of printed books sought after by a growing number of literate adults. The rules, guidelines, and precedents set during this time continue to affect the way we speak and write today. In English Linguistics, ProQuest® brings together 365 titles essential to the study of English linguistics on a historical basis. The facsimiles preserved in the collection comprise a comprehensive and authoritative source of linguistic studies. The titles include textbooks of rhetoric and logic, early grammars (written in English) of most Indo-European languages, grammars of English, dictionaries, studies in the theory of language, and studies on pronunciation and style. Titles reveal linguistic changes, demonstrating language evolution through the years. Here is a sampling:

- Luddus literarius: or, the grammar schoole; shewing how to proceede from the first entrance into learning, to the highest perfection by John Brinsley (1612)
- The art of logick; or the entire body of logick in English by Zachary Coke (1654)
- Accedence commenc't grammar, supply'd with sufficient runes, for the use of such (younger and elder) as are desirous, withoutmore trouble than needs to attain the Latin tongue; the elder sort especially with little teaching, and their own industry by John Milton (1669)
- The many advantages of a good language to any nation: with an examination of the present state of our own: as also, an essay towards correcting some things that are wrong in it (1724)
- *A grammar of the Arabick language* by John Richardson (1776)
- An attempt to render the pronunciation of the English language more easy to foreigners. . . by William Smith (1795)
- A pronouncing dictionary of the English language, . . . (1796)

This collection is essential to those studying linguistics, the history of language, etymology, semantics, the history of education, rhetoric, and sociology.

Gannett, Betty. Papers of Betty Gannett

1929 - 1970

Controversial Marxist writer and teacher, Betty Gannett was a committed member of the Communist Party for over 45 years, remaining active in spite of imprisonment and frequent persecution. Her papers are a remarkable testimony to a free-thinking and courageous woman. As educational director of the California Communist Party, she lectured extensively not only on Marxism but on contemporary concerns such as the Truman Doctrine, the Cuban Missile Crisis and Vietnam. The microfilm edition of her papers reproduces many of these lectures which provide a Marxist perspective on post-war national and international events of interest both to philosophers and to political and economic historians.

Gubernskie Vedomosti

1838 - 1920

The Gubernskie Vedomosti were pre-revolutionary local governmental newspapers published throughout the Russian Empire largely between 1838 and 1917 (although a few titles were issued through 1920.) The newspapers were also published in Ukraine, Belarus, Poland, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, countries of the Caucasus and Central Asia. The Vedomosti were first published in 1838 in 42 cities by order of the tsar. By the beginning of the 20th century, more than 80 were being published. Sometimes the titles differed depending on whether they were oblastnye or voiskovye. Some were daily, other weekly, with print runs ranging from several hundred to several thousand copies. Each newspaper consisted of two sections: official and non-official. The official part published governors' orders and instructions, information on new taxes, court cases, etc. The non-official section was much larger, featuring a variety of information on current local events, plants and factories, sales and market prices, agriculture, transportation, the activity of specific societies, hospitals, educational institutions, libraries, etc. Educational articles on history, geography and economics were also included. In addition, everything from weather forecasts to advertisements could be found here including, on occasion, reprinted material such as diaries, archival documents, biographies and folklore.

Although the non-official sections of these newspapers were originally apolitical, over the years editors began to introduce more and more political material, so that eventually they carried a great deal of information about political events. In 75 cities Gubernskie Vedomosti were the only newspapers available for periods ranging from 10 to 30 years. They were thus the centers of the development of culture, science and education in the district and are tremendously important for modern researchers. No other historical document can replace the Gubernskie Vedomosti, covering as they do the events and news in the lives of people of many districts in Russia for close to a century. Material from the Gubernskie Vedomosti has been used over the years in many scholarly works in history, economics and philology, with many researchers making use of the excellent collection of gubernskie vedomosti in the National Library of Russia in St. Petersburg.

This card catalog will be very useful in helping scholars and researchers find information on holdings of Vedomosti at the National Library.
